Tree planting in Keith Edwick Park went well, a good turn out and thanks to all who turned up. Council supplied over 200 trees. Cathie is organising a roster to water the plants – volunteers needed – contact Cathie Archer.

Police Report - Bike stolen from fenced back yard, Theft of mobile phone, Drug operations, Random breath testing, Noise complaints related to Sports Club on Friday and Sat nights. Recent assault at Machans discussed – in absence of formal complaint, Police can't respond – can only retain the information for intelligence.

Wildlife - Barry has done census of wildlife killed on access road – 24 Oct, 3 Nov and 7 Nov - total of three wallabies. Also 2 bandicoots in that same time plus others. Request Council consider options – Speed humps, Speed limits, Better lighting, Something flashing at night, Signage. Bodies are recovered by Council same day which is good but means that that it is less visible.

Wildlife eating Hall – Pest control to be contacted.

Hall - Insurance – Quotes to be sought.

Maintenance - Cracked stumps & timber damage. Need to list and prioritise maintenance issues. Sign over door deteriorating – Richard suggests that a new base is needed. Floor is deteriorating needs to be re-sealed. If necessary pay someone to write an application to the Gambling Benefit Fund. Council will provide in-kind assistance up to \$2000 per year. Can apply to Council at any time but better to do it sooner rather than later.

Margaret's notes - Fire lit under playground equipment in Keith Edwick Park. Surprised at all the "50" Speed Limit signs at round-a-bout and elsewhere. Council trying to establish footpath between shops and School. Bully the bull has had its horn clipped, **Bert's house** will probably be gone by Christmas but mulberry tree to stay – Margaret will let us know so that the Community can farewell the house. Margaret has commissioned Eve Walker to paint a picture of the house. Consultation will be carried out about what will replace it and also any issues with neighbours. Some people want a gazebo. Council Officers are concerned with possible noise. New steel access gate behind the SES shed – what is it for – Margaret not sure and will inquire.

Machans helps Brisbane. Storms, described by authorities, as the worst in 25 years hit Brisbane and suburbs in November. Two members of our Group who have chainsaw, height safety and tarping skills gave up 5 days to help in the affected areas around Brisbane. These members were not paid for this and have received no reward – other than personal satisfaction. Well done guys.

Training. In addition to Group training, a member has completed an Emergency Operations Centre Course. Other members had nominated for this course but elected to go to Brisbane to help out with dealing with the storm aftermath. This Course will be held again in the New Year.

Skyrail Exercise. This exercise will be held in late November (after submitting this) and will involve floodboat operations, casualties (to be lowered from the Gondolas), Emergency Operation Centre staffing and assistance to carry equipment packs (abt. 30Kgs each) to area of operations. Many members have nominated to participate in this.

Christmas/New Year break. While SES is available for response 24/7, training is suspended over the Christmas-New Year period to allow members a break and to celebrate with their families and loved ones. For Machans Beach SES, the last meet for 2008 will be on December 17 with training again resuming on the 1st. Wednesday in January 2009. On behalf of the MB SES, I would like to wish, not only the members of SES, but the whole community a Merry Christmas and a Happy disaster free New Year. We look forward to seeing existing members and new members in 2009.

Xmas Message from Steve Wettenhall State Member for Barron River

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all at Machans Beach a happy Christmas and New Year. As Christmas time also heralds the storm season, don't forget to check your insurance is up to date and your valuations are realistic. Now is the time to get yourself and your family prepared in the event of a cyclone. While you're at it, do you have an elderly or disabled neighbour? Why not check to see if they need a hand preparing for the storm season.

Carbon Challenge – Month 2

This month we talk "Green power" - renewable energy sourced from the sun, wind, water and waste, which produces no greenhouse gas emissions. It is bought by your energy provider on your behalf from accredited, renewable energy generators. Green Power options are available from Origin, Ergon and most other energy providers – purchased in different amounts to suit your budget. If you choose to have 100 per cent of your home's electricity come from Green Power – you are offsetting all of your household's electricity consumption with renewable energy. It would cost around \$300 each year which is added to your electricity bill if you choose. More details on the website www.greenpower.gov.au

- . Raise your air-conditioner by one degree C in summer and you will save around \$33 each year.
- . Hang more loads of washing on the clothes line instead of using a dryer.
- . Use cold-wash on your washing machine/ run the dishwasher less times a week.
- . Replace 8 incandescent lights with CFLs in frequently used rooms – save about \$115 each year
- . Register for the home service audit where you will get these lights free by phoning 1300 130 372 for a minimal \$50.
- . Reduce your pool pump running time by one hour a day and save about \$45 a year.
- . Turn off stand-by power on appliances to result in about \$66 saving in a year.

Update from Jim Turnour MP Federal Member for Leichhardt

Tourism Update - The Federal Tourism Minister visited Cairns in late November; his third trip in a matter a months. He announced the third instalment of the Rudd Government's \$4m tourism support package, delivered in response to the Qantas cuts that will take effect this month. \$1.25 million will be spent through Tourism Australia on marketing initiatives in Asia, Europe, and New Zealand to generate demand among overseas visitors for tourism experiences in Tropical North Queensland. Importantly, we are already seeing the results of the money spent in the first instalment. So far it has resulted in five airlines announcing they will fly charters into Cairns. These charters will see more than 6,500 additional tourists arriving in Cairns Airport in the coming months. This demonstrates that spending has been well targeted, maximising the economic benefit for Tropical North Queensland.

Another Health Boost for Cairns

The Minister for Ageing Justine Elliot and I were pleased to announce recently that another two transition care places in Cairns will be operational from January 2009. These places will mean another 15 older people a year will be able to go home from hospital earlier. Transition care provides older people with appropriate services or therapy for up to 12 weeks to help them regain their independence before making a decision about their possible longer term care needs.
